CITY OF THORP REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING
MONDAY, JUNE 8, 2015 AT 6:30PM
IN THORP CITY HALL

ROUTINE BUSINESS

1. Call to Order/Pledge of Allegiance
The meeting was called to order at 6:30pm. In attendance were Mayor Stroinski; Alderpersons Baumgarten, Lawcewicz, Abramczak, Smriga, and Wnek; DPW McCredden; Police Chief Verges; Deputy Clerk-Treasurer Pogodzinski; and City Administrator Reeg.
2. Comments and suggestions from pre-registered citizens

4. Discussion and possible action relating to monthly reports:

M/M/S (Wnek, Abramczak) to approve all as presented. Carried unanimously.
 - b. Police Department monthly report
Alderson Smriga asked about training for the officers for all the new software programs being implemented. Verges noted that she would be trained and then trained the others.

OLD BUSINESS

5. Approval of 2015-2016 Agreement with the City of Thorp Professional Police Officers Association and WPPA
M/M/S (Abramczak, Smriga) to approve the contract as presented. Carried by unanimous roll call vote.
6. Discussion and possible action relating to storm sewers and curb radiuses for CTH X project
Due to the concern that pulling all the curb radiuses and then waiting to have the contractor replace them until all storm sewer repairs were complete could result in flooding if a large rain event occurred in the interim, McCredden felt it was safer to have the PWD pull and replace radiuses as the storm sewer repairs were being done.
M/M/S (Wnek, Baumgarten) to have the PWD do the radiuses and storm sewers concurrently. Carried unanimously.

7. Resolution 2015-06-1 “Resolution Requiring the Repair of the Canadian National Railroad At-Grade Crossing at N. Cemetery St. in the City of Thorp”
M/M/S (Smriga, Lawcewicz) to adopt the resolution. Carried unanimously.
8. Award bid for old play structure at Keating Park
Two bids were received for the equipment, the highest of which was \$350.
M/M/S (Abramczak, Baumgarten) to award the bid for \$250 to Kevin Kaszubowski. Carried unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

9. Approve issuance of annual new and renewal Liquor, Operator’s, and Cigarette licenses
M/M/S (Smriga, Lawcewicz) to approve all liquor and cigarette licenses as presented pending a few minor technical edits to applications. Carried unanimously.
M/M/S (Baumgarten, Smriga) to approve the Operator’s Licenses are presented except for Lori Rodezno from whom more information was required. Carried unanimously.
10. Discussion and possible action to select an alternate date for the July 2015 City Council meeting
M/M/S (Lawcewicz, Wnek) to set July 20, 2015 as the July meeting date for the Common Council. Carried unanimously.
11. Resolution 2015-06-2 “Resolution Supporting Improved Broadband Access in Clark County”
M/M/S (Baumgarten, Smriga) to adopt the resolution. Carried unanimously.
12. Approval of wage rate increase for Dan Wundrow for obtaining DNR Waste Water Operator certification
M/M/S (Baumgarten, Lawcewicz) to approve a \$.50 per hour wage increase for Dan Wundrow for obtaining DNR Wastewater Operator certification. Carried unanimously.
